Layla Guan

Layla Guan, 11, is a young pianist from California, USA. She has studied piano for five years and has already been recognized with many top prizes in international competitions.

In 2025, she performed with the Savaria Symphony Orchestra, one of the top orchestras in Hungary, at the Vienna Beethoven Conservatory. That year, she also won Second Place at the Chopin International Piano Competition in Hartford, CT, and III Award in the Paderewski International Piano Competition. She also won Second place in the Advanced Romanic Category in the USOMC piano competition.

In 2024, she was a finalist in the 31st International Fryderyk Chopin Piano Competition for Children and Youth in Szafarnia, Poland, she also performed with Elisey Mysin in the Bay Area local Music Event. Moreover, she continued to win top results in major competitions. She has also performed at Carnegie Hall in New York multiple times and has won First Place in many competitions every year.

Outside of piano, Layla enjoys ballet, swimming, and art.



Jacqueline Luo

Jacqueline began her dance journey at the age of ten, later than many of her peers. Inspired and guided by her uncle, Kevin Luo, co-founder of 1st Position Dance Academy, she committed herself to rigorous training and soon emerged as a standout performer. Her passion and perseverance culminated in her solo piece "Flying Apsaras" earning top honors at the 2024 Sacramento Spotlight Dance Competition, including Overall Diamond, Division Winner, Category Winner, First Place, and Judge's Choice, as well as a Gold

Medal at the Taoli World Dance Cup. In 2025, she reached another milestone by winning Solo Diamond at the Spotlight Elite Level competition, the event's highest tier.



Mohan Chen

Mohan Chen is a sophomore at the University of California, Davis, majoring in Global Disease Biology. He began playing the Hulusi, a traditional wind instrument from Yunnan, at the age of 11 and has continued to grow as a dedicated performer. Mohan earned a Grade-10 Performer Certification from Yunnan Arts University and has received recognition in both the United States and China. Mohan has performed at cultural events, community gatherings, and university programs, sharing the unique sound of the Hulusi with diverse audiences. He values music

not only as an art form but also to foster cultural exchange and mutual understanding.



Manqi Liang

Manqi Liang is a classical pianist from China. She began studying piano at the age of four. She received her Bachelor of Arts in Music from Cal Poly SLO, under the guidance of pianist William Spiller, and is now pursuing her master's degree in Piano Performance at Sacramento State University, under the tutelage of Richard Cionco. Manqi is passionate about expressive, thoughtful interpretation—both in solo and

collaborative settings. She recently performed internationally at the Music and More Festival in Bosnia and Herzegovina, where she premiered *Tango*, a piano quintet by renowned composer Ionel Petroi, performed *Romance* by Amy Beach, and solo piano work as part of the festival program. With a musical journey that bridges Eastern and Western traditions, Manqi brings sensitivity and clarity to her performances. Her goal is to connect with listeners through sound, storytelling, and sincerity in every piece she plays.



Sophia Lao

A 4th-year undergraduate at UC Berkeley studying Data Science, Legal Studies, and Public Policy, Sophia began her classical music journey on the piano at age 6 and the cello at age 9. She has been a member of the UC Berkeley Symphony Orchestra (UCBSO) since 2022, which recently played four sold-out concerts on a tour of Central Europe. Her past orchestral experiences include principal cello positions in the Sacramento Youth Symphony (SYS), California All-State String Orchestra, and the Davis Young Artists Chamber Ensemble. Some of her awards include winning 1st prize in the CalASTA Solo String Competition, 1st prize in the Crescendo

International Music Competition (with a Winners Recital performance at Carnegie Hall), and 1st prize in the MTAC VOCE Competition (NorCal Division). She is currently furthering her cello education with Jonathan Koh at UC Berkeley. She attributes much of her present-day work ethic and success to her past music educators as well, including Prof. Andy Luchansky and Jia-mo Chen on cello, and Dr. Natsuki Fukasawa and Huanyu Dou on the piano. When not practicing or rehearsing, you may find Sophia trying new restaurants and cafes, exploring beauty and fashion trends, biking around Berkeley/SF, or catching up on the entire MCU series.



Daniel Kang

Daniel is a fourth-year student pursuing a Chemical Biology degree at UC Berkeley and is currently studying with Antoine van Dongen. Recently, Daniel had the privilege of performing the Sibelius violin concerto with the UC Berkeley Symphony Orchestra (UCBSO) after becoming the youngest winner of the university-wide concerto competition. His music journey began at the age of seven with Elisabeth

Szojka in Calgary, Alberta, Canada. He later went on to study with William van der Sloot at the Mount Royal Conservatory of Music. In 2019, he continued to foster his musical intuition under Juilliard Pre-College faculty Ann Setzer and Elizabeth Chang, as well as at the Manhattan School of Music with Patinka Kopec. The following year, Daniel moved to southern California to learn under the tutelage of Joan Kwuon at the Colburn Music Academy. He has won several local, national, and international competitions, including the Calgary Performing Arts Festival, Canadian Music Competition, and American Protege. Additionally, he has had the distinct honor of performing in venues such as Weill Recital Hall and the Stern Auditorium in Carnegie Hall in New York. Outside of his studies, you can find Daniel biking, weightlifting, or belting karaoke. Daniel is also a proud citizen of Canada.



Justin Wahby

Justin Wahby is a recent graduate from Stanford University with a dual degree in Management Science & Engineering and Music (Piano Performance) with Honors. Justin began playing the piano at age four and

has also studied at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music Pre-College.

Justin has received top prizes in numerous competitions nationally and internationally. In 2022, Justin was awarded the Blew-Culley-LaFollette Prize for Piano Performance, presented as part of the Stanford Music Department Awards. The previous year, he was inducted into the Music Teacher's Association of California (MTAC) Young Artist Guild, earning a five-year tenure granting him professional performance opportunities through MTAC brand-sponsored concerts. Justin is also a Young Arts Foundation Winner in Classical Music, having received Honorable Mentions in both 2022 and 2021. In 2021, he was featured on National Public Radio's "From the Top," showcasing young classical talent across the nation. This November, Justin will appear as soloist with the Camellia Symphony Orchestra, performing Robert Schumann's Piano Concerto as part of the orchestra's 2025-26 season (Season 63).





Ms. Milan studied at Xi'an Conservatory of Music and the China Conservatory of Music. She is a nationally recognized vocalist who has won multiple awards in prestigious national vocal competitions, including receiving the National Government Award for Vocal Performance from the Ministry of Culture twice. Her song "Understanding" ("懂得") received the "Five-One Project Award" from the Publicity Department of the CPC. Her performance of "Hometown Sounds" ("听乡音") won the Gold Prize in the "National Radio New Songs Selection." Additionally, her songs "Master Brother" ("师傅大哥") and "Bringing Macao Home" ("接澳门回家") received Silver Prizes in the "China Music TV Competition. "During her career as a professional

performer, Ms. Milan portrayed a wide range of stage characters, each with distinct styles and emotional depth.

After relocating to the United States, Ms. Milan has continued her artistic journey as a passionate vocal instructor and performer, dedicated to nurturing the next generation of singers and sharing her love for the art of singing.



Jiamo Chen

Jiamo Chen is a cellist and dedicated music educator based in Sacramento, California. He holds a bachelor's degree in cello performance from California State University, Sacramento, and Master of Music degree from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and has an extensive performance background as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player across North America and Europe.

In addition to his performance career, Mr. Chen is committed to nurturing the next generation of musicians. He serves as a cello instructor at the Pacific Institute of Music and manages J's Music Studio. Recent performances include collaborations with pianist Kirsten Smith, featuring works by Bach, Beethoven, Debussy, and Barber. Chamber music appearance includes piano trio with pianist Shinae Kim and violinist Anita Felix. He has also appeared with the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, Sacramento Philharmonic Orchestra, North State Symphony, Stockton Symphony, and the Sacramento Choral Society.

At his leisure time he enjoys spending time with his family, good food, and playing with his two cats.



Gong Ding

Gong Ding is a lyrical tenor with the Avant-garde Song and Dance Troupe, as well as a songwriter and composer. With over 50 years in the arts, he has devoted himself to performance, composition, and teaching, and is a certified senior vocal instructor by the Central Conservatory of Music.

He studied under Jiang Jiaxiang, a vocal educator at the China Conservatory of Music, and soprano Qin Yin from Jilin Province. Rooted in the classical bel canto tradition, he advocates "comfortable singing." His mastery of *mezza voce* (half voice) is exceptional, his high-register control outstanding. With a broad repertoire and refined technique, he performs with ease and versatility.

Ding Gong has received multiple national awards,

including second prizes from China's Ministry of Culture, the National Radio and Television Administration. He has released two solo albums of original works and was invited as a featured lecturer on Shandong TV's *Master Class*. To this day, his stage presence remains free and charismatic, his voice as clear and bright as ever—delivering nuanced, moving performances of striking impact.


